



 Post 16 Curriculum Coverage

In Summer 5 & 6, Gateway 1 will be working on the following themes and topics for sessions.

 <p>Functional English</p>	<p>Our theme for Summer 5 &amp; 6 is 'Comedy'. We will be looking at the book 'Gangsta Granny' as well as looking at funny poems and limericks. Reading (speaking and listening): Students will work on intonation and pitch when reading aloud in 1:1 situations, small and large groups. Comprehension: understanding and answering questions on what they have read. Dictionary work. Writing -Using capital letters at the beginning of sentences and full stops at the end consistently. To add conjunctions to link sentences together. Use descriptive words when writing explanations.  <i>*Some of our pupils will be sitting their Entry Level tests in English.</i></p>
 <p>Functional Maths</p>	<p>Our topics during Summer 5 &amp; 6 will include addition and subtraction, time and measurement, money and reading graphs.  <i>*Some of our pupils will be sitting their Entry Level tests in Maths.</i></p>
 <p>Independent living skills</p>	<p>Students will be preparing simple meals as independently as possible.</p> <p>In addition, they will be using the skills acquired from last terms cleaning topic and learning new cleaning knowledge needed when preparing food.</p>

 <p><b>Employability</b></p>	<p>Some students will be completing individual research regarding their career aspirations, discussing personal qualities and qualifications required for the job role. They will research information on the internet and produce a booklet and action plan.</p> <p>Some students will be in the forest school working towards the John Muir Award</p>
 <p><b>Health and Fitness</b></p>	<p>Students will continue have lessons in keeping active in and out of school and understanding the importance of physical fitness by accessing the Duke of Edinburgh scheme or having P.E sessions once a week. They will practice their swimming skills either in the school pool or at Queen's Park Leisure centre.</p>
 <p><b>Options</b></p>	<p>Students will continue in their chosen options groupings of hair and beauty, gardening, care and art. Visiting professionals from the different employment areas will visit periodically and deliver bespoke sessions.</p>
 <p><b>Community</b></p>	<p>Community continues to underpin the Post 16 curriculum, most students will use public transport (with staff support) as they access their local community, practicing the skills that they learnt during their theory on travel training from last term.</p> <p>We will be revisiting keeping safe when on public transport, finding safe places and people, looking at timetables and using money in real life situations.</p> <p>In addition, to promote life after school and becoming independent, students will be supported in using supermarkets to purchase ingredients for cooking meals,</p>

	cafes and restaurants to buy drinks and meals.
	<p>In PSD we will be focussing on Sex and Relationship Education (SRE) in Summer 5 &amp; 6.</p> <p>In addition, pupils will revisit lessons on puberty, peer pressure, emotions, managing relationships and what healthy relationships look like and how to have them.</p>
