Post 16 Curriculum Coverage

In the Spring term 3 and 4, Gateway 2 will be working on the following topics and themes for sessions.

  <p style="text-align: center;">Functional English</p>	<p>Students will be focussing on functional English tasks across the curriculum such as reading shopping lists, following recipes and following simple verbal instructions. Some students will also be working on our Murder Mystery topic, where we will examine the books of Sherlock Holmes.</p>
  <p style="text-align: center;">Functional Maths</p>	<p>Functional Maths will be embedded throughout the curriculum to enable students to practice in everyday settings, this will cover a variety of themes such as money, time and measure.</p>
  <p style="text-align: center;">Independent Living Skills</p>	<p>Students will continue to prepare simple snack and meals for lunch throughout the week whilst using simple household appliances. This will include working in the croft, food tech room and the Pod. Students self-prepare lunch 4x per week and are actively involved in all preparation and cooking.</p>
 <p style="text-align: center;">Employability</p>	<p>The first half term will see students working in the Forest Schools area of school, working on their team building and resilience skills. The 2nd half term will see the class engaging in an enterprise project to sell at the Easter fayre.</p>
 <p style="text-align: center;">Health</p>	<p>Health will comprise of students being active in school and out in the local community. Understanding the importance of exercise and physical fitness by swimming, dance and walking.</p>
 <p style="text-align: center;">Options</p>	<p>Students will continue in their chosen options groupings of hair & beauty, gardening and art. Visiting professionals from the different employment areas will visit periodically and deliver bespoke sessions.</p>
