Post 16 Curriculum Coverage

In the Summer term 5 and 6, Gateway 2 will be working on the following topics and themes for sessions.

 (ABC) Functional English	<p>Students will be focussing on functional English tasks which are embedded across the curriculum such as reading shopping lists, following recipes and following simple verbal instructions. Some students will also be working on our Comedy topic, where we will examine the books of David Walliams.</p>
  Functional Maths	<p>Functional Maths will be embedded throughout the curriculum to enable students to practice in everyday settings, this will cover a variety of themes such as money, time and measure. We will increase our ILS sessions this term to ensure students are using their maths skills in practical and functional situations.</p>
  Independent Living Skills	<p>Students will continue to prepare simple snack and meals for lunch throughout the week whilst using simple household appliances. This will include working in the croft, food tech room and the Pod. Students will self-prepare lunch 4x per week and are actively involved in all preparation and cooking.</p>
 Employability	<p>Students will continue to develop their employability skills by communicating appropriately, working as a team and working safely in different environments such as out in the garden, poly-tunnel, food tech room and running a café based in class.</p>
 Health	<p>Health will comprise of students being active in school and out in the local community. We hope the Summer term will bring good weather and enable us to use the local park gym equipment and enjoy the local countryside on walks. Also we constantly embed the importance of exercise, physical fitness and healthy eating by swimming, dance and walking.</p>
 Options	<p>Students will continue in their chosen options groupings of hair & beauty, gardening and art. Visiting professionals from the different employment areas will visit periodically and deliver bespoke sessions.</p>



Community

Community continues to underpin the P-16 curriculum, students will continue to visit supermarkets to shop, cafes and restaurants to purchase drinks and snacks and other community facilities such as a sports centre, cinema and shops.
