

Assessment cycle



Pupils in the EYFS are assessed using the Derbyshire Small Steps assessment tool.

At the end of their Reception year pupils will be assessed both against the Early Learning Goals as 'emerging', 'at expected level' or 'exceeding'. Due to pupils SEN, most of our pupils do not achieve the Early Learning Goals and will almost always be assessed as 'emerging' against all of the goals. Therefore, to show progress, at Ashgate Croft School we have devised our own system for setting targets. Pupils are base-lined using the tool at the end of A1 term. Targets for their *expected progress* will then be set. These will be set based on each pupil's need and starting point and used teacher judgements. Pupils' progress is also mapped using graphs which clearly show the progress that is being made, these are shared with parents.

Pupils with Physical difficulties

The steps within the PRIME gross and fine motor areas are still felt to be too big for pupils with physical difficulties. Therefore we only expect progress from their base-line within the same band. Pupils will also be assessed for their physical development using the PMLD assessment tool, where we expect progress to be at least good (see PMLD assessment tool).

Pupils with PMLD

Expected progress in PRIME (except gross and fine motor) is 5-7 points from their starting point.

Pupils with SLD

Expected progress in PRIME and SPECIFIC is at least 2 bands of progress.

Pupils with MLD

Expected progress in PRIME and SPECIFIC is at least 3 bands of progress.
